Laborers and Freight, Stock, and Material Movers Manually move freight, stock, luggage, or other materials, or perform other general labor.	9,050	\$39,210	High school diploma or equivalent may be required
Stockers & Orders Receive, store, and issue merchandise, materials, equipment, and other items from stockroom, warehouse, or storage yard to fill shelves, racks, tables, or customers' orders.	6,230	\$35,520	High school diploma or equivalent may be required
Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers Drive a tractor-trailer combination or a truck. May be required to unload truck.	3,570	\$50,740	High school diploma or equivalent required. Requires commercial drivers' license
Light Truck Drivers Drive a light vehicle, such as a truck or van, primarily to pick up merchandise or packages from a distribution center and deliver.	1,980	\$42,350	High school diploma or equivalent may be required
